## From The Rabbi's Desk

Our focus of late has been so exclusively political in nature as a result of the Presidential campaign that we tend to overlook the more compelling challenge of maintaining our identity in a pluralistic society. Our discussions have centered, most recently, on the world about us so that we have forgotten to focus on the particularistic nature of the Jewish persona.

The problem is not unique to our generation. We can find examples throughout Jewish history, even in the life of our father, Avraham.

Avraham's greatest challenge, perhaps his most defining moment, was the Akeidah - the Binding of Yitzchak. The story of this test is introduced as a continuation of the preceding stories. "And it was after these matters that Elokim tested Avraham." The precedents of this challenge led to it.

Immediately before the Akeidah we read the story of the covenant between Avraham and Avimelech - the King of the Pelishtim, and of an altar dedicated by Avraham to Elokim, the Universal God.

Avraham had erected other altars but had dedicated them to Hashem. This altar, constructed after his interaction with other people, the Pelishtim, was dedicated to Elokim, the God of all People. It was this same characteristic of Elokim that tested Avraham and asked him to sacrifice his son, his only son, Yitzchak. It was the covenant and the altar preceding the Akeidah that led Elokim to test Avraham.

In his dealings with those about him, Avraham rightfully chose to teach of a Universal God. Akeidah was a challenge not to overlook the unique

character and destiny of Avraham and the generations that were to follow him.

If he fell short in his attempt to portray the universal by ignoring the particular, then the blessing of Yitzchak in Avraham's old age would become unnecessary.

We are once again confronted with the test of Avraham. In a pluralistic society are we able to make certain that the Isaacs of our generation live the precious legacy that is ours? It is not always easy as we get caught up in so many broader issues. We continue to lose sight of who we are.

We have a dual mission. We must live and thrive in our times. We must use our faith and wisdom to impact upon the spirit of our times. However, in order to achieve this we must develop what is uniquely and particularly ours. We must study Torah inside the walls of our world in order to have an

effect on the world outside. We must develop a deep seeded sense of identity, bearers of the torch of Avraham and Yitzchak, so that our community can continue to serve as a beacon of both universal and particular truth.

The windows of a synagogue must duplicate those of the Beit HaMikdash, narrow inside, wide on the outside, as a symbol of the universal light that is spread from the privacy of our particular meeting place with God.

It is God's way of thanking us for our emunah, for our labor, for our energy.


