

Instead of an answer, peals of laughter burst from little Tassie and elderly Tumbler. Kupsie's two fellow Kiddush cups laughed so loud and so long that their sides ached and tears streamed down, threatening to dull the brightly polished silver.

"Sure must've sounded queer if you don't know what it's all about," panted Tassie, and even usually dignified Tumbler had trouble composing himself. At last they were calm enough to explain.

"We weren't reciting the Ten Plagues, you know. Anyway, we're not at the Seder yet. These are types of food."

"Do you take me for an idiot? Of course I know the difference between plagues and fruit!" Kupsie was angry that they had laughed at him.

"Calm down," said Tumbler, "I had in mind to teach you as well as Tassie. In the Torah, the Land of Israel is praised as exceptionally fruitful. These seven products are singled out. Therefore they're preferred, requiring a longer blessing after eating them. Also, by the order in which they're listed, we can see their individual preference."

"Let me show," Tassie was eager to tell what he'd learned. "Wheat is Number 1, barley Number 2, grapes Number 3, figs Number 4, pomegranate Number 5."

"That means, when you want to eat grapes and figs, for example, take a grape first because it comes before figs on the Torah's list."

"On Tu b'Sh'vat, when it's customary to eat many types of fruit, these rules come in handy. But here's more. There are two products which head all others regardless of their standing on the list. One is bread or cake, made from grain. And the other is — guess what, Kupsie?"

"Wine, naturally," came the quick answer.

"Spoken like a true Kiddush cup," laughed Tassie.

TWO WAYS TO LOOK AT A CLOCK (A BROKEN ONE, THAT IS)

I

Here's a riddle: Which is better, a clock that's always wrong or one which is broken and doesn't run at all?

Answer: The broken one. Because at least twice in every 24 hours it shows the correct time!

II

A tiny village tucked away behind high mountains was so self-sufficient that it existed for years without contact to the world. Only one thing was lacking: they had no watchmaker. Gradually all watches and clocks became inaccurate, unreliable and of no use. Some gave up in disgust and put them away. But others continued to wind them and take care of them, though realizing that the time they told was wrong.

Years later a watchmaker came to town. He quickly set to work to repair all clocks. Those which had been kept running he repaired with ease. But those which had been neglected, had become rusty and were beyond repair.

III

A recent experience brought these clock stories to mind. Two visitors came to Shul on a weekday morning, men who ordinarily don't participate in the daily Minyan. They were observing Yahrzeit. One had brought his T'filin along and wore them. Not correctly, though. T'filin of the head must lie totally on hair, the outer edge precisely where the first hair roots are. But his T'filin dangled precariously low, much nearer to nose than hairline. The other man wore no T'filin at all.

IV

What's the connection, "clockwise?" The first story says: Better no clock than a wrong clock, because wrong is wrong, is bad, is misleading, while broken is at least frank, consistent, and doesn't attempt to fool you. The man with no T'filin was like that. He unashamedly behaved in public the way he acts at home — no T'filin. What's more, he committed a simple wrong: no T'filin. Whereas his colleague

compounded the transgression. To wear T'filin in the wrong place is equivalent to none at all and, in addition, he pronounced the T'filin blessings in vain.

V

"Ah, but you're wrong, totally wrong!" cries Story No. 2. "You'll have a rusty clock if you let it run down. You won't be able to have it fixed if ever you get a repair man. Better wind it, even if it shows the wrong time."

The man with the T'filin on his nose was like that. True, he hadn't fulfilled the mitzvo properly and he committed additional sins by reciting the blessings in vain. He's all wrong, of course, but he isn't rusty. He winds the T'filin on arm and head occasionally and his is a "repairable" clock.

VI

A personal note: This article was written reluctantly, with heavy heart and throbbing conscience. Why? Because it's dangerous, that's why. Two doors open in opposite directions and there are no clear, convincing "walk" and "don't walk" signs. Which is better, the "Lady" or the "Tiger?" Does logic lean toward the first clock, and emotion to the second? Is it always right to say: rather nothing than the wrong thing? Is it always wrong? Is it always right to say: half a loaf is better than none? Is it always wrong?




