A complete program of educational and recreational activities, in a Jewish atmosphere, is provided for the children.



### Memorial Prayer for Those Fallen in Battle



"My experiences with life have taught me that the Gentiles will treat the Jews with great consideration if the Jews make themselves entitled to that consideration, But I would like to sound a word of warning to Jews who insist on going places where they are not welcome. Do not try to go where you are not wanted. Your racial pride should be so great that you, as a Jew, would not want to go "While living with Gentiles I learned any place where a Jew is not welcome."
