Although our Congregation conducts no Hebrew school under its immediate auspices, that function being excellently fulfilled by the Central Jewish Institute adjoining our Synagogue, we feel, nevertheless, that there might be other ways in which direct service may be rendered by us in this matter. There are many parents who prefer private instruction in Hebrew for their children. Rabbi Lookstein, therefore, requests such parents to communicate with him so that he might recommend to them well trained and qualified teachers to whom the instruction of the young may safely and profitably be entrusted. Individual programmes of study will be made up for each child by the rabbi together with the teachers. Constant supervision will be exercised so that the progress of each child will be carefully watched and encouraged. Any requests in this matter will receive the prompt attention of the rabbi.
