This traditional custom of spending a most pleasant hour of religious-social activity at the Synagogue, part of which is given over to the discussion and reading of interesting chapters of the bible, is, indeed, most appropriate for the eve of the Holiday which commemorates the giving of the Torah to our people.

Rabbi Lookstein will be there to expound parts of the Bible that may require interpretation, and of course—refreshments will be served.

CHEVRA MISHNAIIS CELEBRATES SIYUM

At an elaborate Seudah Shlishith, the Chevra Mishnaiis celebrated its Siyum of the six orders of the Mishna on Saturday, afternoon, May 9th, in the vestry rooms of the Synagogue. Rabbi Margolies recited the "Hadron" and spoke appropriately of the significance of the occasion.

Mr. Jacob D. Cohen, President of the Congregation, introduced Mr. Harry Fischel, "Gabbai" of the Chevra to act as toastmaster. Mr. Fischel, after tracing the history of the Chevra, announced that this was the thirteenth Siyum since the organization of the Chevra Mishnaiis 25 years ago. He then made a stirring appeal urging those present to join in the study of the Mishna, and thus identify themselves with the great body of "Lomdim" of all Israel.

Rabbi Lookstein in his talk emphasized the importance of "Torah Lishmoh", knowledge for its own sake, as a concept of Jewish scholarship.

Dr. Samuel Friedman, recently elected a Trustee of the Congregation, then delivered a brief but very learned talk on the importance of Mishna.

Mr. Joseph Polstein, the former President of the Congregation, also stressed the significance of a Siyum to the spiritual life of a Congregation.

It was the opinion of all, that this was the most colorful and enthusiastic Siyum that was ever held in our Congregation.
