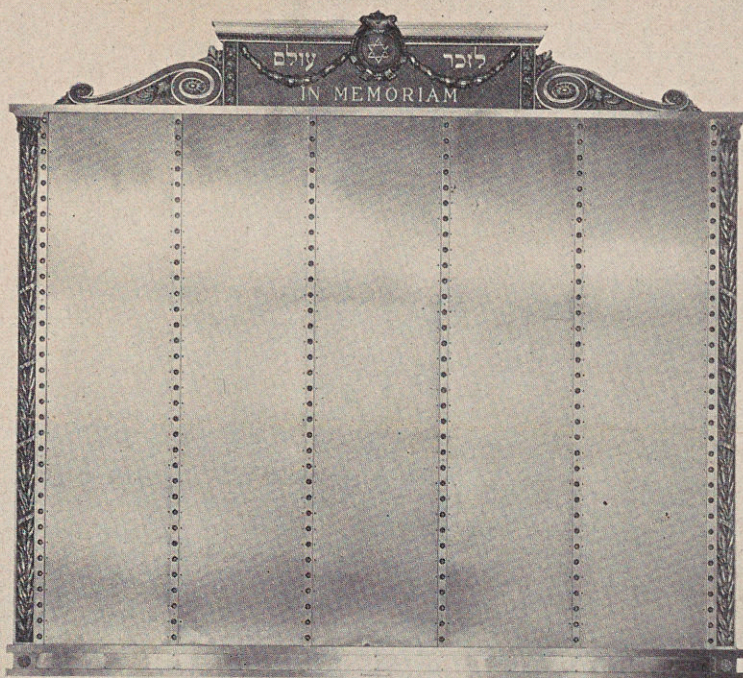

The above is a reduced size photograph of the beautiful Memorial Tablet which has this week been erected on the west wall of our synagogue. The tablet is made of the finest grade of heavy hand chased cast bronze with a 14 gauge sheet bronze background re-enforced with cold rolled steel. It is 87 inches high by 94 inches long and has been declared by those who know, to be a masterpiece of artistic workmanship, among the finest of its kind.

The tablet is divided into five columns with room for 34 name plates in each column with a light on either side of each name plate. These lights will be lit on the Yahrzeit of the individual whose name is inscribed on the respective plate. In addition to the name the inscription on the plate will also include the date of death according to the Hebrew and the English calendars.

You can pay a no more beautiful tribute to a dear departed relative than by inscribing his or her name on this tablet as an everlasting memorial in the sacred precincts of the House of God.

The scale of prices for space on the tablet has been planned to satisfy even those of most moderate means. Every possible step has been taken to make the reservation of space on the tablet within the reach of all.

The committee in charge will be glad to furnish any further information that you may desire.
