## High Holiday Notices

Choice seats are still available for the High Holidays and may be had from the Seat Committee which is in session every evening and Sunday all day in the synagogue. All reservations must be made in person and the better seats will naturally go to those who will apply earliest.

We wish to call to the special attention of our worshippers that we are anxious to avoid the embarrassment and the confusion caused by worshippers occupying seats that were never reserved by them and to which they therefore have no claim whatever. While we do not want to turn anyone away, we nevertheless feel that people ought to realize that the High Holiday income constitutes the principal means for the synagogue's existence. It is therefore decidedly unfair to take advantage of the house of God. Those whose means do not permit them, will be gladly accommodated by us with whatever seats they need, if they only apply in time. But all worshippers must in fairness to themselves, their fellow-worshippers and the synagogue have seats reserved.

In order to enforce this regulation there will be an officer at the door during the High Holidays and worshippers will be expected to show their tickets of admission. None will be admitted without tickets.

Cooperate by observing the following:

1. Come as early as possible.
2. Join in the congregational singing.
3. Respect the wishes of the ushers on the floor.
4. Worshippers should be in their seats before the Sermon begins. Doors will be closed during the Sermon.
5. Do not remove your talith or leave your seat until after the benediction is pronounced.



## **The Ramaz Academy Will Open on September 22nd**

Registration of new students in the Ramaz Academy, sponsored by our congregation, will begin on Wednesday, Sept. 8th. Children will be admitted to the pre-kindergarten class, the kindergarten class and the 1A. The classes will be limited in size and parents who are interested in having their children admitted should not delay and communicate at once with Rabbi Lookstein or the office of the synagogue.

## **Executive Director Appointed By Synagogue**

During the hot summer months the officers of the synagogue met regularly to lay the plans for future activities of the congregation and to provide for its continued growth. As one of the means to assure growth and activity, the officers selected Mrs. David Andron to serve in the capacity of Executive Director. Mrs. Andron comes to us after several years of successful leadership in the Mizrahi Women's Organization of America, where she raised large sums for the organization's projects in Palestine. Previous to that, she was the active head of the Tranquility Camp which provides summer vacations for poor Jewish children of the city.

Mrs. Andron's first task will be the management of the annual dinner-dance of the congregation which will take place on December 12th next in the Rainbow Room. She begins her duties immediately after Rosh Hashanah. We wish her well in her new post, we welcome her into our midst and we are confident that she will earn the cooperation of the congregation and all its affiliates.

## **Vestry Rooms Redecorated**

The lower floor of the synagogue has been made to look like new as a result of thorough redecorating. The chapel, library, office, and hallways were repainted and work is about to be begun on the social hall. New electric fixtures will shortly be installed throughout the lower floor. The work has been done under the supervision of the House Committee, of which Mr. Jacob Alpert is chairman.
