The most momentous problem that has confronted our people in all of the 1800 years of our exile, is the possibility of establishing a Jewish state in Palestine.

The proposal, however, involves many serious and important questions: Shall we establish a Jewish state? What shall the size of it be? Why was the recent Zionist Congress at Zurich so terribly divided on the question of a Jewish state?

All these questions and their implications, I plan to discuss this Saturday and next Saturday from the pulpit. I cordially invite you as an intelligent Jew or Jewess to listen to what I hope will be a comprehensive and unbiased treatment of the entire subject. Incidentally, this Shabbath we "bench" Rosh Chodesh Kislev, and I am sure that you must have planned to attend services anyway.

I shall be very glad to welcome you this Saturday and the next, and I shall be happy to receive your written reactions to my analysis of that important problem.
