A New Project for the Children

The principal features of the service will be the Sabbath Eve prayers and songs, a weekly story, kiddush and a benediction. This service is open to all boys and girls of the neighborhood, and together with the Sabbath morning services, will slowly lay the foundation for a week-end school. We urge parents, therefore, to send their children to us every Friday at 4:30 and every Saturday morning at 10:30.
