Registration at Ramaz Academy

Attendance at Services

One of the greatest problems which religious Jews have had to face has been that of encouraging people of their various religious denominations to attend their synagogues. Some leaders felt and thought that they ought to adopt certain secular means of attracting the people to their religion.

We are of the opinion that the only powerful and common attractive force which can draw people, young as well as old, to the synagogue, is the strength of religion itself. The panaceas which did not possess the spiritual force or intensive religious depth could not solve the problem of religious indifference.

A movement for greater and firmer affiliation with the synagogue ought to be begun. Such a movement however must be prompted not by the fleeting and publicized interests that catch the eye, but by the deep and profound spiritual urge and yearning for those things which are finer and more beautiful in life. We propose the more frequent attendance at the synagogue, where a nobler and broader point of view may be cultivated as the first step toward more intimate identification with a spiritual life.
