### The Religious Factor in Anti-Semitism

For his Purim sermon this Sabbath, Rabbi Lookstein has chosen "—And Their Laws Differ,"—Haman's claim and the Jews' counterclaim.

Under this subject, the Rabbi will discuss the significance of the religious factor in anti-semitism with special emphasis upon the article by John Cournois in the December Atlantic Monthly, in which a solution to the problem is proposed. That the subject is vital and momentous need not be stressed and our people are cordially invited to listen to the Rabbi's discussion and analysis.

### Children Love Purim

The gaiety of Purim is intended not only for the adults, but for the children as well. Our congregation, anxious to utilize every festival as a means of interesting the children in Jewish life, has made special arrangements for them for this holiday.
