Passover Warnings

With the approach of Passover, Rabbi Lookstein finds it necessary to caution our congregation about certain matters.

1. Great care must be used in the purchase of Passover food articles. Nothing should be bought loose. Only articles that are packed and sealed and bear the stamp of approval of recognized Rabbi or Rabbinic organization may be bought.

2. The fact that something is sold in the Passover department of a department store, is not sufficient guarantee for kashruth.

3. Any chometz left over Passover may not be used after the holiday, unless previously sold through the "Sale of Chometz".

4. Many are not clear about the method of kosherizing utensils for Passover. The Rabbi will be glad to answer any questions pertaining to that.
