Ramaz Academy Opens Second Year

The Ramaz Academy, established by our congregation last September, opened its second school year on Monday, September 19th. The school which began promisingly enough last year, has exceeded every expectation of its warmest well wishers. From its modest beginning with only six students, it has now grown to an enrollment of over forty children coming from the finest homes of the community. A kindergarten, a first, second, third and fourth year grades are already available with additional classes to be started in succeeding years. Mr. Benjamin Brickman of the School of Education of Brooklyn College, has been appointed as supervisor of the school and last year's teaching staff was increased by several excellent additions. Transportation to and from school is being provided for children who live a distance away. Every possible accommodation and every advantage of progressive education is offered to the students. This is indeed an opportunity of a life time for parents of our neighborhood who want the best in Hebrew as well as secular education for their children. Rabbi Lookstein will be glad to confer with parents regarding the admission of their children.

It has been our practice in the past to leave a number of seats for those who cannot pay for their reservations.
