Mrs. Beatrice Siegel, our kindergarten, is a graduate of Teachers College Columbia University, and the Hebrew Teachers Training School for Girls. She has had years of experience in handling children and is expertly suited to her task.

The kindergarten room is large and airy and adjoining it is a play-roof which the children use frequently. The finest equipment has been made available for the kindergarten. The daily program includes arts and crafts, music, dramatics with sufficient time for supervised outdoor play. Children from the ages of four to six may be enrolled.
