WHAT OUR SYNAGOGUE OFFERS

Have you ever been confronted with the question "What does my Synagogue offer?" Kehilath Jeshurun stands ready to answer that question emphatically and enthusiastically. For there are many, many advantages to membership in Kehilath Jeshurun. Let us start with the newest affiliation, the RAMAZ ACADEMY, a progressive school offering a comprehensive and combined Hebrew and Secular education to boys and girls of elementary school age. Classes range from the kindergarten through the fifth grade. The synagogue sponsors a BOY SCOUT TROOP and a GIRL SCOUT GROUP; the former meeting at the Central Jewish Institute every Wednesday from 6:30 until 8:30 and the girls meeting every Wednesday afternoon at three o'clock in our social hall.

The YOUNG PEOPLE'S LEAGUE is an active group of fine young men and ladies who have as their objective the establishment of a scholarship for the Ramaz Academy. Their program is a cultural and social one, and their meetings are held on alternate Monday evenings.

The MEN'S CLUB is what its name implies: a fine organization of married and unmarried men, whose program is a combined social and cultural one. Meetings of the Men's Club are held every other Thursday night.

The SISTERHOOD is a very vital part of and plays a major role in the life of Kehilath Jeshurun. Having as their goal the acquisition of three scholarships for the Ramaz Academy, they are striving hard towards its realization. So far one and a half scholarships have been awarded and there is every evidence that before very long the balance will be had. The Sisterhood contributes generously to many, many appeals which reach them from individuals and from organizations and assists materially in the upkeep of our Synagogue.

There are several affairs sponsored during the year so that the social aspect is not neglected.

Sisterhood Membership is open to wives, daughters and friends of Kehilath Jeshurun. Anyone wishing to join will be accorded a hearty welcome.

Membership in Kehilath Jeshurun entitles one to a man's and a woman's seat for the High Holidays and for the entire year. Services are held three times each day; an impressive service including an inspiring sermon delivered by Rabbi Lookstein is held each Sabbath and a special children's service is held each Saturday in the Chapel, at 10:30. Free instruction and preparation for Bar-Mitzvahs is given to the children of a member. Reduced rates for the rental of the Synagogue, chapel, or social hall are given. Those interested in the cultural program of the Synagogue are invited to the Mishnah class which meets after services every morning, to the Talmud Class which meets every Monday night in the Library, and to the class of Jewish Culture Through The Ages, which meets on alternate Wednesday evenings.

As can be seen there is much to be derived during one's lifetime from membership in Kehilath Jeshurun. Yet Kehilath Jeshurun service extends even when life has departed. For it provides free burial facilities and funeral provisions for the immediate family of a member and furnishes a minyon, if it is desired, during the week of mourning.
