Our "Cultural" Class

Rabbi Lookstein held his audience spellbound last week when he discussed the elements of similarity during the various epochs of Jewish persecution. Starting with the crusades in the eleventh century and ending with the Dreyfus case in the nineteenth, the Rabbi pointed out the underlying causes of each outburst against the Jews and the international repercussions which each aroused.

The Rabbi's masterful handling of this time-worn subject injected into each one a spirit of optimism for the ultimate restoration of Jewish rights.

There were many questions asked, all of which were answered in the scintillating manner characteristic of Rabbi Lookstein. In answer to a statement by an eminent physician that. while medical science, through its research, has learned the cure for many epidemics by separating the germ from the host, there seems to be no solution for the epidemic of Anti-Semitism, the Rabbi responded in like medical terms. In order to kill the germ, we must build up the host and to build up the host we must provide an old-fashioned diet of religious education and religious action.
