The traditional service for the First Born will be held Monday morning, April 3rd, following the regular morning service, which will be held as usual at 7:15.

Passover Warnings

With the approach of Passover, Rabbi Lookstein finds it necessary to caution our congregation about certain matters.

- Great care must be used in the purchase of Passover food articles. Nothing should be bought loose. Only articles which are packed and sealed and bear the stamp of approval of a recognized Rabbi or Rabbinic organization may be bought.
- The fact that something is sold in the Passover department of a department store, is not sufficient guarantee of Kashruth.
- Many are not clear about the method of koshering utensils for the Passover. The Rabbi will be glad to answer any questions pertaining to that.
