As a preface to this course, which could also be called "Prophets of Nationalism" Rabbi Lookstein took his audience to Geneva, where, with him, they reviewed the happenings of the 21st Zionist Congress.

Everyone sat entranced listening to the analysis of this most important congress. When the Rabbi recounted their experiences during those days prior to the announcement of war, everyone shuddered and silently repeated a prayer of thanksgiving that our Rabbi and his beloved wife had returned to us safely.
