Trustees Vote to Establish Afternoon Hebrew School

One of the best attended meetings of the Board of Trustees in recent years was held last Thursday night in the library of the synagogue. The Board heard reports of the successful dinnerdance, of the newly formed Men's Club and of the remarkable progress of the Ramaz Academy.

In elaborating upon the academy report, Rabbi Lookstein explained that what was needed to give the congregation a comprehensive educational system was an afternoon Hebrew School to meet three afternoons a week. The Rabbi reported that in his conversation with parents who were affiliated with the congregation, the request for the establishment of a school sponsored by the congregation was continually made. They felt that it was rightfully due them in return for their membership and that in the absence of such a school, they had no other alternative but to avail themselves of Sunday schools in the neighborhood that were in no way adequate.

After much discussion a resolution was unanimously passed to establish an afternoon Hebrew School to begin its sessions with the opening of the school year in September, 1940. The president was authorized to appoint a committee to make all the necessary arrangements for the carrying out of this resolution. This news has been happily received by all those who have heard of it and inquiries from interested parents are already quite numerous.

In the absence of Mr. Margaraten who was out of town, Mr. Sokolski, the vice-president, turned the chair over to Mr. Max Etra who presided at the meeting.
