# "WAKE UP AMERICA" FATHER KERNAN says

---

## Celebrated Radio Prelate, In Men's Club Address Strikes Warning Note To Whole Nation

---

"The great rank and file of Americans do not know the danger to themselves of anti-semitism in America," said the famous radio orator, Father Kernan, in his stirring address to the Men's Club and their guests at the regular monthly meeting Tuesday night, March 12th in the social hall of the Temple. For one hour the famous protagonist of the Gentile drive in this country against anti-semitism gave his hearers a practical lesson in the viciousness of propaganda. The subject of his address was "Propaganda Termites." No one listening had any doubt at the conclusion that it was of no avail to talk to prejudiced Americans. Their minds cannot be changed. But the hundred million disinterested and apathetic American citizens must be shaken out of their smugness and made to realize that the excuse of anti-Jewishness is merely a cloak to cover the real purposes of the perverse movements, namely to change this government from a democracy to a dictatorship. "America is founded on the principle of the personal right of every individual," said Father Kernan. "That principle can only continue permanently if all Americans are informed of the menace to it that exists at the hands of the Coughlinites, Silver Shirts, German Bunds and other anti-American groups who attack democracy under the false guise of American patriotism."

The entire supply of one hundred copies of Father Kernan's book "The Ghost of Royal Oak" was purchased by interested members in the audience. Each copy was autographed by its author. Mr. Samuel M. Kaplan voluntarily contributed a very generous donation to the Men's Club in appreciation of the excellent constructive work it is doing.

The meeting opened with the singing of the Star Spangled Banner by the entire assembly, led by Cantor Robert R. Fingerth. Rabbi Lookstein, in his usual opening news commentary period of ten minutes, delivered a bold diatribe against Great Britain's latest white paper, restricting the sale of Palestinian land to Jews.

The calibre of speakers and the fine work being accomplished by the new Men's Club under the sterling leadership of the president, Ira F. Weisman, is meeting with a splendid response from the public as demonstrated by the number of new members who have joined the ranks of the Men's Club during the past thirty days. Among them are Samuel B. Cooperman, Daniel Eberstein, Alexander Garfein, Samuel Greenberg, Paul Lowin, E. F. Robbins, Harry Siegel, Philip Waxman and A. R. Winer.

A collation was served by the Men's Club after Father Kernan's address.
