#### BRILL THRILLS MEN'S CLUB WITH FRANK TALK ON "SEX"

There was a "different" sort of forum meeting held in the Social Hall last Tuesday evening when the eminent psychiatrist Dr. A. A. Brill addressed the Men's Club on the subject "The Psycho-Sexual Life of Man". It was different from any other meeting in the series, in that there was no discussion of current world politics, war or Anti-Semitism. The famous specialist in psycho-analysis, who is said to be the successor to Freud, held the crowded meeting hall spellbound for over an hour, as he told his audience of the restrictions to sex impulses which civilization has imposed upon the highest form of animal, man (and woman).

In reply to a question put to him after the discussion, Dr. Brill said that in his opinion much of the aggression and the sadism that characterize the life of Hitler is due in no small measure to a sex-factor.

Rabbi Lookstein opened the meeting with a fifteen minute period of Jewish news, in which he gave an absorbing account of the great New Zionist protagonist, Jabotinsky, who is now in New York, and a very brief but informative obituary on Dr. Cyrus Adler, who passed away this week.

Ira F. Weisman presided in his usual capable manner, despite cold and fever. The Men's Club is fortunate in its choice of so conscientious and hard-working a leader.
