RECORD ATTENDANCE MARKS CLOSING SISTERHOOD MEETING

MRS. JACOB RUDD ELECTED PRESIDENT

"Thrilling" is the only word to aptly describe the closing meeting of the Sisterhood, held last Monday. Such trite terms as "grand", "lovely", "enjoyable", "interesting", might also be applied. But none would be as expressive as "thrilling".

After the President, Mrs. Alpert, had extended profuse thanks to Mrs. Maxwell Shapiro, who offered the hospitality of her home in a most gracious manner, reports of the various committees were given. The Treasurer's report was so encouraging that a motion was made and unanimously carried that an additional scholarship be awarded the Ramaz Academy.

Mrs. Joseph H. Lookstein, Chairman of Membership, gave her report, stating that eighteen new members had been added to the roster this season.

Mrs. Alpert then gave her report, beautifully written and exceedingly well-delivered. She described the many and varied accomplishments of the organization and expressed her appreciation to all those who had assisted her during her three years of leadership. Tears dimmed the eyes of many as she concluded her report with a firm resolution to continue her interest, assistance and cooperation and with a sincere prayer for the new regime to grow from "strength to strength". At the conclusion of her lucid report, Mrs. Alpert asked for the slate of officers prepared by the Nomingting Committee. The following were then nominated and unanimously elected: President, MRS. JACOB RUDD; Vice-President, MRS. GEORGE JAC-OBS: Treasurer, MRS. IRVING SHEIN-BLUM; Corresponding Secretary, MRS. ISIDOR GIVNER; Recording Secretary, MRS. HARRY ETRA. Mrs. Rudd, as spokesman for the newly-elected oflicers, thanked the members for the confidence evidenced in them, and promised full cooperation, and expressed the hope that she would be able to follow the precedent set by the outgoing President. Mrs. Rudd, in the name of Sisterhood, presented Mrs. Alpert with a beautiful silver platter, in recognition of her able leadership.

The guiding head of the Sisterhood, Rabbi Lookstein, was then called upon to speak. The Rabbi spoke of the necessity of the Jew awakening from his lethargy, from his smugness. In the light of what is happening to hundreds of thousands of our co-religionists, we dare not remain untouched. indifferent, calloused. The picture the Rabbi painted was dark and discouraging. What we need, the Rabbi emphasized, is courage, faith! Without it we are doomed. With it, we can and ' will survive! The Rabbi spoke of the growth of the Ramaz Academy, from the time of its inception, three years ago, with six children, to the present status with an enrollment of 63 students. He complimented the Sisterhood for the part it had played in the life of this unique institution.

Link is preeminently qualified both to lecture on and to demonstrate the effectiveness of this curious phenomenon.
