Rabbi Discusses Current World Situation

Under the general subject "A Tragedy of Errors," Rabbi Lookstein discussed the European situation in his sermon last Saturday. He will continue on the same subject this Saturday with special reference to the lesson that America may learn from the experience of the European nations.

In announcing the appointment of these committees, Mr. Etra said that his policy was to designate as many new members as possible. "We are grateful to those who have served in the past but we feel together with them that new friends and new workers must always be won and trained in Synagogue service."

FATHER'S DAY SABBATH TO BE SPONSORED BY MEN'S CLUB

Saturday, June 15th, will be Father's Day Sabbath in our Synagogue. The idea for this unusual and important undertaking which will be sponsored by the Men's Club, was suggested by a prominent member of the organization, Mr. Alvin Austin, who is National Chairman of the Father's Day Committee.

An elaborate program is in the process of preparation in order to make this Sabbath outstanding among the Sabbaths of the year. Special features will be added to the regular service and the officers of the Men's Club will join the officers of the Congregation in presiding over the services that day. The Synagogue will be appropriately decorated. Our Boy Scout and Girl Scout troops will be invited to participate. At the close of the services a buffet Kiddush will be served in the social hall.

Our Congregation is probably the first to associate the national observance of Father's Day with the Synagogue and assigning to it thereby an important religious significance. We may be establishing an example that will be followed in years to come by synagogues and churches all over the country. We therefore urge fathers, mothers, sons, daughters, to be with us on Saturday, June 14th, for Father's Day Sabbath.


Sisterhood Notes
