RAMAZ ACADEMY OFFICIALLY SELECTED AS MODEL SCHOOL

Rabbi Lookstein received official notice from the Jewish Education Committee of New York, established under the Friedsam Foundation, that the Ramaz Academy has been officially designated as a model school under the sponsorship of the Committee. In his letter to the Rabbi, Dr. Alexander M. Dushkin, Executive Director of the Committee writes:

"I am very glad indeed that our Committee has found it possible to take this first step in cooperation with your interesting educational experiment and I trust that it may lead to fruitful results."

This happy news comes as the Academy opens its fourth school year with registration already in progress and with the promise of an enrollment that will greatly surpass that of last year.

The Academy, as is generally known, offers a combined Hebrew and English education and eliminates the necessity of a Sunday school or an afternoon Hebrew school. From 9 to 3:30 the children receive a complete and comprehensive program of studies that includes the Hebrew and the English curricula. The English studies naturally correspond to those offered by the schools under the Board of Education of New York City.

Parents in the neighborhood have in the Ramaz Academy an opportunity that is the envy of every community in the city. Communicate with the Rabbi without delay and arrange for the enrollment of your child. Remember also that in addition to its regular classes, the Academy conducts a kindergarten which meets from 9 to 12:30 every day.
