#### Our Talmud Torah

We are indeed proud to announce to all our friends that we can now offer an afternoon Hebrew school to the children of our members and seat-holders. The Central Jewish Institute Talmud Torah, adjoining the synagogue, which has been in existence for the past 25 years, we now have the pleasure of referring to as "our" afternoon school. This has been made possible by a special arrangement made between our congregation and the Institute.

We therefore appeal to all our members and seat-holders to communicate with us at once regarding enrollment of their children in the afternoon school of the Institute. Rabbi Lookstein will be glad to consult with parents and Mr. Karni, the principal of the Talmud Torah, may be reached any day in the school office. Please do not delay because sessions have already begun.

#### Synagogue Donates Religious Articles to South American Communities

In response to an appeal made by the Joint Distribution Committee, our congregation has this week sent a large shipment of prayer books, Bibles, and a shofar to refugee communities established in South America. We are assembling another shipment to go off soon.

## A Uniform Prayer Book for the High Holy Days

A new and major regulation which will greatly affect the character and impressiveness of our High Holiday services this year is the proposed use of a uniform "machzor" or prayer book. There are at the present time about 150 such books in the possession of the congregation, but we need at least 500 more. The price of a book is \$1.25 and for it one receives a handsomely bound volume containing the Rosh Hashana and Yom Kippur services with a beautiful English translation.

There are two ways how this uniform machzor can come into use in our synagogue. One way is by having everyone purchase a volume, either from a book store or directly from us. Another way is to have some of our good friends donate a certain number of these books in memory of some dear one. We will, of course, be glad to insert a suitable inscription on the inside cover of the book. An order blank is included in this bulletin for the use of those who would like to purchase these books.

Help us to further beautify our services and help us render them more intelligible and impressive by obtaining for yourself and helping others obtain a uniform machzor.


# JOHANNES STEEL


#### Rabbi Interviewed on Ramaz Academy
