MEN'S CLUB NEWS

Dr. Clinchy Addresses Stirring Meeting on "NATIONAL UNITY"

"I AM AN AMERICAN" Day was celebrated Tuesday evening by the Men's Club of the Kehilath Jeshurun Synagogue, the climax of which was a stirring address by Rev. Everett R. Clinchy, National Director of the National Conference of Christians and Jews.

Ira F. Weisman, executive head of the organization, presided. The meeting was opened with the singing of the national anthem by Cantor Robert R. Fingerth. Rabbi Joseph H. Lookstein, in his remarks, stated that there is no such thing as a "Jewish vote". Members of the Jewish faith, when casting their ballots, vote only as Americans, he said.

The principal speaker of the evening was Dr. Clinchy, whose topic was "National Unity". He explained the excellent progress made by the National Conference of Christians and Jews since 1928, the year of its founding. This organization has as its members, followers of the Protestant, Catholic, and Jewish persuasion. It does not interfere in the realm of theologic dogma at all. But in all other spheres of thought, such as Americanism, peace, charity, church attendance, spiritual values, etc., it does engage in interfaith collaboration. By permeating educators and clubs and organizations of all sorts with its gospel of brotherhood and good will it has accomplished great results in the direction of national unity. It pleads for tolerance of one faith for another. Except for the inevitable presence of the few bigots, who will always remain as many another type of sinner, Dr. Clinchy maintains that another decade will see a considerable lessening of religious prejudice.

The Men's Club will hold its next forum on the regular meeting night, the second Tuesday (November 12) of the month. An internationally famous speaker will address the group on the occasion. All information will be published in the next edition of the Bulletin.
