Class in Hebrew Organized

Under the sponsorship of the Sisterhood and the Parent Teacher Association of the Ramaz Academy a class in Hebrew has been organized and will begin sessions on Wednesday morning, November 13th at 10:30 A.M. Classes will meet once a week from 10:30 to 12:00 in one of the classrooms of the Central Jewish Institute adjoining the synagogue. The instructor in charge will be Mr. Leon J. Karni, principal of the Institute Talmud Torah and an expert in adult education.

The class will begin on the elementary level and by the end of the year it is expected that the students will be able to read, write and speak simple Hebrew.

The fee is \$15.00 for the entire school year which will end in May. Thus far ten women have enrolled. Should the number reach twenty the fee will be reduced to \$10.00 for the year.

Classes for High School Boys and Girls Organized

Rabbi Lookstein announces the formation of classes for high school boys and girls to meet once a week on Tuesday nights from 7:30 to 9:30 in one of the classrooms of the Central Jewish Institute. The classes will be conducted by the Rabbi and Mr. Leon J. Karni, principal of the Institute Talmud Torah. Two courses will be offered: one from 7:30 to 8:30 in Bible and the other from 8:30 to 9:30 in Jewish History. Mr. Karni will teach the first course and Rabbi Lookstein the second. The fee for both courses will be \$10.00 for the school year ending in May.
