Ramaz Fathers Meet with Rabbi

Too frequently is the task of supervising the education of a child left to the Mother. In this busy material world, little time is allotted to the father to discuss with his child the progress he is making at school.

Fathers of Ramaz Academy students were given the opportunity to discuss their child's educational welfare at a meeting held last week, called by the Rabbi. The Rabbi stressed the importance of cultivating every possible point of contact with the child. This, the Rabbi said, can best be done by example and by companionship. It was an intensely interesting meeting and from comments made, it was a very beneficial one.

The Rabbi also spoke of the necessity of a fund-raising project to take care of extra-budgetary requirements of the school.

The fathers immediately agreed to the plan proposed by the Parent Teacher Association to cooperate with the Synagogue in the procuring of ADS for the Souvenir Journal. A very substantial proportion of the amount brought in by Ramaz parents will be used for the Academy. Before the meeting adjourned several of those present left contract forms and have thus started the ball a-rolling.

A request was made for more such meetings of the fathers and it was agreed to hold one in the near future.

JEW'S' PERMANENCE CERTAIN SAYS LUDWIG LEWISOHN

Address at November Meeting of Men's Club

Hits New High Mark of Brilliance

The Jew is not doomed but will live forever, said Ludwig Lewisohn, the internationally celebrated Jewish novelist, lecturer, publicist and scholar last Wednesday night at the regular monthly forum-meeting of the Men's Club in the social hall of the synagogue, before an audience composed of men and women, members and non-members of the club and the synagogue. The widely publicized address of the noted litterateur drew crowds from all parts of the city, and it taxed the facilities of the hall to the limit of its capacity, many standees lining the four walls in their effort to catch every precious word of the speaker.

Discussing the subject, "The Jew and the Future", Ludwig Lewisohn, who has so often before dramatized the Jew's plight in society in epoch-making novels, explored the fundamentals of the historic character and state of the Jewish people. "Most people entirely misconceive of the future, in reference to the Jew because they have not made a correct historical analysis of his character, which produces his fate," said Mr. Lewisohn. "As it goes for an individual so it goes for a people. You can thus always explain future by character. The Jew by dogged adherence to his convictions of freedom as opposed to slavery, learning instead of

blind ignorance, justice and not cruelty, has from time immemorial been the dissenter and has thus kept alive not only himself and his race but the ideals of justice for all mankind. This sort of character can not be obliterated and will not," continued the famous author.

The meeting opened as usual with the chanting of the national anthem by Cantor Fingereth and the assembly. Mlle. Katherine Ettlinger, famous European vocalist gave a delightful repertoire of songs. Rabbi Lookstein conducted a most informative ten-minute "newscast" of Jewish news. President Ira F. Weisman, who officiated as master of ceremonies, announced the participation of the club in the fund-raising campaign of "Bundles for Britain", by means of selling advertising space in the Souvenir Journal of the synagogue for their forthcoming dinner and dance.

These monthly forum-meetings of the Men's Club have become one of the most exciting events on the winter calendar as a result of its policy of having nothing less than preeminent speakers. At its next meeting, the second Tuesday in December, the community is again invited to come as guests of the club to hear one of the most illustrious lecturers in the world. His name will be announced in next week's issue of the Bulletin.
