Poletti Thrills Thanksgiving Audience

Lieut. Governor Poletti delivered a masterful address at the Thanksgiving services of our Congregation held last Thursday in the main Synagogue.

A large and colorful audience which filled the entire lower floor of the main Synagogue and part of the balcony was visibly moved by a service which was generally regarded as the most impressive one of its kind.

Cantor Fingeroth and Machtenberg's choir sang the appropriate religious melodies beautifully and Rabbi Lookstein's special Thanksgiving prayer composed for the occasion was conceded to be a masterpiece of inspirational literature.

Most touching of all was the ceremony surrounding the presentation of a beautiful American flag by the Men's Club of the Congregation. Mr. Ira Weisman, president of the Club, delivered a short but deeply-moving presentation speech, and in an equally moving statement Mr. Max J. Etra received the flag on behalf of the Congregation. The procession and the massing of the colors was a sight long to be remembered. Troop 606, the Congregation's own, has reason to feel proud of the part it played in this procession.

The corps of ushers under the leadership of Mr. George Jacobs handled the large audience with utmost efficiency and dignity.

Began operatic career in Germany in 1925. Became leading tenor of Berlin Municipal Opera Company. Toured America in 1930 with the German Grand Opera Company. Returned to Berlin Municipal Opera Company as leading tenor until the Nazi Regime forced him to discontinue his work.

BORN IN HAMBURG

At the age of eight already charmed Humperdinck by her performance of Gretel in his opera "Haensel and Gretel."

Became prima-donna at the Metropole Theatre, Berlin.

Delighted leading capitols in Europe in both grand and light opera.

Is now a member of the faculty at the Birmingham Conservatory of Music.

A further feature will be the noted American violinist Ralph Hollander.

Mr. Hollander, noted American violinist, graduated at Juilliard School of Music.

He made his debut in Italy where he was enthusiastically received. Last season, he was soloist with the Civic Orchestra under the baton of Eugene Plotnikoff. He then toured South America with great success during the summer. This season he has been engaged by the National Music League and will appear in recitals throughout the east.
