We invite you to the second part of the festival and especially to yizkor services which will be held on Saturday morning at 10:45. In order that there may be no interference with the mood of meditation and solemnity, no one will be seated during the service proper and we therefore urge all our worshippers to be in their seats before the service begins.

Maurice Samuel Discusses Historical Perspective of Present Struggle before the Men's Club

On Wednesday evening, April 9, 1941, Maurice Samuel, author of "The Great Hatred" and translator of "The Nazarene," addressed the Men's Club on the subject "Twenty Centuries Before and After the Advent of Christianity".

"Jews above all people" Mr. Samuel began, "should view history in the light of perspective, and not with their noses right next to the tapestry of current events". Aptly referring to the theme of "The Great Hatred", Mr. Samuel explained that anti-Semitism among Christians all over the world is not so much hatred of the Jews themselves, as a concealed hatred of Christianity and the restrictions it imposes on their baser instincts. "Jews" he said, "are not so hideous, so rich, so ill-mannered or so powerful as to drive people to insane hatred. But the bonds of

conscience and repression which Christianity enforces do drive many of its adherents to frenzy. And they cannot forgive the Jews for having introduced this religion of restraint and repression to them."

The meeting opened, as usual, with the singing of the "Star Spangled Banner", led by Cantor Fingeroth and accompanied on the piano by Ruth Casriel, and Rabbi Lookstein then spoke briefly on the significance of the Passover season.

Nathan B. Kogan read an illuminating report on the scope of work being done by the American Jewish Congress, to which he is our organization's delegate.

After the discussion period, during which Mr. Samuel answered questions most thoroughly and analytically, the meeting was concluded with the regular collation.
