MEMBERSHIP MEETING REELECTS ETRA PRESIDENT HERMAN GOLDMAN AND MURRAY ROSENBERG BECOME TRUSTEES

The Annual Membership Meeting of the congregation was held Wednesday night in the social hall. In spite of the inclement weather a goodly number were present, including representatives of the Sisterhood and of the Men's

Max J. Etra read the Sixty-Sixth Annual Financial Report of the congregation which showed a substantial improvement in the congregation's financial condition. The president explained, however, that the burden of past indebtedness was considerable and that while a good deal of it was cleared up, there is still much remaining

Rabbi Lookstein explained to the membership that the principal problem confronting us was the improvement of the synagogue structure. The Rabbi said that the main synagogue requires redecorating, recarpeting and relighting and that the lower floor of the synagogue must be completely remodeled to accommodate the increased activities of recent years.

Reports of the Cemetery Committee, the House Committee and the Membership Committee were made by Mr. George Jacobs, Mr. Jacob H. Alpert and Mr. Harry Etra, the respective chairmen of these committees. Mrs. Jacob Rudd reported for the Sisterhood and Mr. Ira Weisman for the Men's Club.

The membership then responded with enthusiastic applause when the Nominating Committee brought in the names of Herman Goldman and Murray M. Rosenberg and nominated them for trusteeship of the congregation. They were unanimously elected, the feeling

of all being that these two gentlemen richly deserved the honor bestowed upon them. The other trustees elected were Saul J. Lance, Abraham R. Winer, Samuel M. Kaplan, Thomas Bornstein, Jacob D. Cohen and Dr. Henry A. Rafsky.

Election of officers then took place and the following were unanimously chosen: Max J. Etra, President; Dr. Henry A. Rafsky, Vice-President; Saul J. Lance, Treasurer; and Abraham R. Winer, Secretary. The first two were reelected, the latter two were newly elected. The Rabbi in an appropriate address installed the officers and wished their administration success.
