Ramaz Registration Begins

New students are daily being enrolled in the Ramaz Academy in the kindergarten as well as in the regular grades. The Rabbi who may be seen daily at the synagogue office for registration, is confident that the enrollment in the Academy this year will far surpass that of last year. Parents are therefore urged not to delay and to consult the Rabbi on the education of their children.

Several new appointments were made to the faculty of the Academy. Mr. Emanuel Gottlieb of the Jewish Theological Seminary and Yeshiva College, was appointed to the Hebrew Department; Mrs. Blossom Fineman of the New Jersey College for Women and Miss Selma T. Bloch of the New York Public School system, were appointed to the English grades. Mr. Shalom Altman becomes the school's music teacher and Mr. Norman Tress, famous artist and illustrator of books, will be in charge of the arts and crafts department.

The school also happily announces that Benjamin Brickman, supervisor for the Academy for the last three years, was awarded his Doctor of Philosophy degree from Columbia University this June. Dr. Brickman is a member of the staff of Brooklyn College.
