## **Prof. Schorr Memorial**

A packed congregation attended the Memorial Services sponsored by the American and World Jewish Congress in our synagogue last Sunday. Rabbi Lookstein presided and the speakers included the charge d'affaires of the Polish Embassy in Washington, Minister Kwopeshevsky, Dr. Stephen S. Wise and Dr. Nachum Goldman. Seated on the platform were also the Polish Consul General of New York and Senator Chereshevsky of the Polish Senate.

Prof. Schorr was the Chief Rabbi of Warsaw, a world renowned scholar and a leader of European Jewry. He died recently in a concentration camp.
