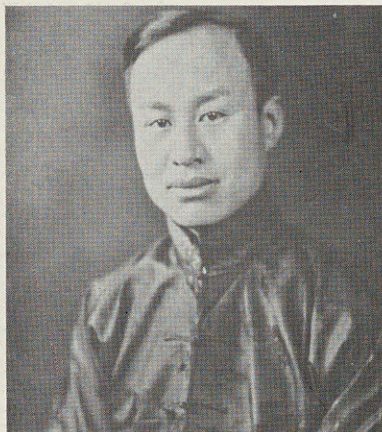

Political prisoner and a leader in the Student Patriotic Movement in 1919 when the Chinese students in Peking started a nation-wide campaign against the award of Chinese rights and territories in Shantung Province to Japan at the Versailles Conference. Dr. Meng is a contributor to a number of American periodicals on international relations, such as Foreign Affairs and Pacific Affairs. His book "China Speaks" on the Manchurian crisis of 1931 is still regarded as not only a valuable document on that conflict but also indispensable background material for the present undeclared war between China and Japan. He is in charge of the Chinese Educational Mission to the United States and is Director of China Institute in America which office has charge of educational and cultural relations between China and the United States.
