Sale of Chometz

The sale of Chometz is not merely a formality but rather an important law, the observance of which is necessary for the maintenance of the Kashruth of a Jewish home. Chometz (food or utensils) that is retained over the Passover holidays may not be used after the holiday unless previously sold through the procedure prescribed by the Jewish Law. The sale of Chometz will begin Sunday, March 29th and will continue until Wednesday, April 1st. Rabbi Lookstein may be seen for that purpose in the Synagogue every morning and evening.

Service for the First Born

The traditional service for the first born will be conducted on Wednesday, April 1st, following the regular morning services which will be held at 7:30. It is obligatory upon all first born to attend this special service. Where the first born is a minor, the parent may attend the service in his place.

JOHN B. KENNEDY

Speak on

"This Intolerant and Intolerable World"

Mr. Kennedy was born in Quebec, Canada, and was educated, as he himself puts it, "Partly in England, partly in Canada, mostly in the United States, at St. Louis University." Immediately upon graduation from college, he entered the newspaper field and soon became Associate Editor of Colliers. In 1933 he joined the staff of the National Broadcasting Co. When the American Tobacco Co. arranged to sponsor the Metropolitan Opera broadcasts, they engaged Mr. Kennedy to do the back-stage comment. Mr. Kennedy will also be remembered for many other important broadcasts, such as the Magic Key and the famous RCA Victor programs. He is well-known as the voice on Fox Movietone News and is the Master of Ceremonies of the "Listen America" WJZ Sunday radio program.
