One Hundred Attend Annual Membership Meeting Max J. Etra, Saul J. Lance, Abraham R. Winer, Abraham Wiener, and Jacob H. Alpert — New Administration

In the newly decorated social hall one hundred members of the congregation and their families met at the Annual Membership Meeting on May 6th. The list of those present would read like a veritable Who's Who.

The message of the president, the report of the treasurer and the reports of Mrs. Jacob Rudd for the Sisterhood and Mr. Ira F. Weisman for the Men's Club were enthusiastically received.

One of the important items on the business agenda was the reappointment of Rabbi Lookstein to a new term. The Rabbi at this meeting completed eighteen years of ministry in Kehilath Jeshurun and when he walked in with Mrs. Lookstein, the assemblage rose to their feet and greeted them to the echo.

One of the highlights of the meeting was the induction of the fourteen new members. The induction address was delivered by the Honorable Samuel Levy who outdid himself in substance, inspiration and wit. A surprise feature was the response in behalf of the inductees by Justice Bernard L. Sheintag who spoke most touchingly of the congregation and its officials.

Cantor Robert R. Fingeroth was reappointed for the eighth time and in his response proved that he can not only sing but orate as well. Rev. Joseph Adler, came in for a good deal of praise from those present.

That a cemetery report could be made delightful and witty was proved by Mr. George Jacobs, Chairman of the Cemetery Committee, who reported on several sales of plots and on how the income from such sales went to amortize the capital indebtedness of the congregation.

Mr. Jacob Rudd, Chairman of the Nominations Committee, then presented the slate of officers and trustees. It was accompanied by a few well chosen and highly appropriate words. By unanimous choice and amidst hearty applause the following officers and trustees were elected: Max J. Etra, President; Saul J. Lance, Vice-President: Abraham R. Winer, Treasurer; Abraham Wiener, Secretary. Trustees: Jacob H. Alpert, Samuel Levy, Louis J. Singer, Abraham Wiener, A. I. Simon and Albert Sokolski. As his first presidential act, Mr. Etra appointed Jacob H. Alpert as comptroller.

The traditional closing of an annual meeting was not overlooked and Rabbi Lookstein, delivered an address that briefly outlined the significant factors in the life of our congregation over the last seventy years. The catered buffet which followed provided a social climax and the gathering stayed on right into the night eating, drinking and merry making. The refrain that seemed to be on everyone's lips and that was echoed and reechoed for days after the meeting was "never a meeting like this - we can't have too many of its kind."
