The Men's Club is acceding to the wishes of the Red Cross and is abandoning the distribution of the victory kits to the soldiers for the reason that the army has made arrangements for such distribution by the Red Cross in the future.

The entire executive committee has volunteered its services to the Greater New York USO Appeal.

The Men's Club has provided ten camp weeks for youngsters who would otherwise not be afforded an opportunity to attend camp.

Ira F. Weisman has been appointed a member of the synagogue coordinating committee, representing the Men's Club.
