### Synagogue Sunday School A Reality

Immediately after Rosh Hashanah registration of pupils will begin in the projected Sunday School that is about to be established under the sponsorship of our congregation. Space has already been obtained in the building of one of the leading private schools in the neighborhood. Our Sunday School will therefore be housed in a modern, well equipped and ideally located school building.

Children from the ages of six to fifteen will be eligible for admission. A prospectus of the school, giving full details, is in preparation and will soon be available to all interested parents.

### Scroll of Honor for Men in the Service

We are about to prepare a scroll of honor on which will be listed the members and the immediate relatives of members who are in the military service of our country. This scroll, suitably framed, will be placed in an appropriate part of the synagogue. Special prayers for the safety and well-being of the men in service will be read at the Yom Kippur services.

We therefore ask our members to send us the names and military ranks of their sons in the service. We make a similar request of the members of the Men's Club and Sisterhood. We are very anxious not to have any names missing from the scroll of honor. It is up to you, therefore, to inform us either by phone or letter not later than by Wednesday, September 16th.



### The Selichoth Service

Our selichoth service last Saturday night at midnight was the most impressive of its kind. A fine and representative congregation of men and women participated in it. The cantor was at his best and the Rabbi's closing prayer for our men in the service brought a tear to many an eye.

A good deal of the impressiveness of the service was contributed by the special uniform selichoth with a fine English translation which was used this year. The selichoth were the gift of our esteemed associate trustee, Mr. Charles B. Jacobs who donated them to the synagogue in memory of his recently departed mother.
