Ramaz Academy Receives Charter From State Department Of Education

We are pleased to announce that this week the Ramaz Academy received a Charter from the Board of Regents of the State of New York.

Last Spring the Ramaz Academy was visited by representatives of the State Board of Education who made a searching examination of the secular and religious curriculum of the school, the methods of teaching, the staff qualifications, the school plant and the school finances. They presented their findings to the State Board of Regents. Rabbi Lookstein, Principal of the Academy and Dr. Benjamin Brickman, Supervisor, were called by a Sub-committee of the State Board of Regents to answer further questions about the Academy.

The fact that the Ramaz did receive the Charter speaks for itself, for it means that the State Board of Regents found the financial status and the course of education satisfactory.

We are deeply grateful to our Vice-President, Saul J. Lance, through whose efforts the Charter was received.
