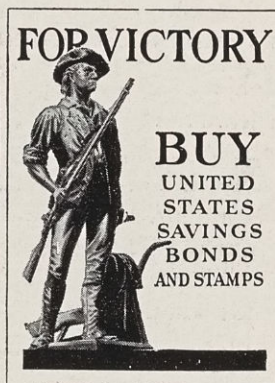
A Trio of Boys
