JAMES G. McDONALD

speak on

"THE WORLD TODAY"



Mr. James G. McDonald, humanitarian, educator, reporter and radio commentator, is a recognized authority on foreign affairs and is internationally known for his work as League of Nations High Commissioner for German Refugees, 1933-36. He was the first president (1918-1932) and one of the founders of the Foreign Policy Association and is at present its Honorary Chairman, While League of Nations High Commissioner for Refugees he supervised and directed the placing of 60,000 refugees in new homes throughout the world. He received the American Hebrew Medal "for outstanding service in promoting better understanding between Christians and Jews" in 1934. In April 1936, he joined the ediorial staff of the New York Times, relinquishing this post upon assuming office as President of the Brooklyn Institute. More recently, in May of this year, he was appointed Chairman of the President's Advisory Committee on Political Refugees. In addition to which, he is a Trustee of the American Council of the Institue of Pacific Relations, the Twentieth Century Fund and a member of the Board of Directors of the National Advisory Council on Radio in Education. He has been a member of the teaching staff of Harvard and Indiana Universities and of Radcliffe College. At present he can be heard daily at 2:30 P.M. on WJZ in an analysis of the news.

Our own Rabbi Lookstein will deliver a short talk on "Jews in the News", prior to the principle address.
