Saul Lance spoke for and about the abolition of donations at the Torah; Rose Rudd reported on Sisterhood happenings and Ira Weisman, on Men's Club activities. Abe Winer gave a resume of the semi-annual financial report which was a delight to hear. Plans for the forthcoming Thanksgiving Services were discussed by our President. Lou Singer spoke of the proposed theatre party and Fred Margareten, Chairman of the Year Book, was an inspiration in his report and pep talk on ADS.

unanimously elected to the membership body and welcomed by the Chairman, Louis J. Singer: Irving Angel, Samuel D. Cooperman, Benjamin D. Gold, Harry W. Golding, N. David Landau, Albert N. Newman, and Simon Vogel.

Rabbi Lookstein reported on the progress of the Ramaz School and the Sunday Religious School and spoke of the Young People's Study Group, which now has an enrollment of ten students with many prospects for the coming session.

The social hour which followed the meeting was an indication of the attitude of our members.

No one wanted to leave and it was long after midnight before the lights in the social hall were extinguished.

We are certain this is a welcome fore-runner of more such interesting and enjoyable gatherings.
