THIS SATURDAY'S SERMON

A great furore has been caused by a recent announcement that a number of reform rabbis have established an organization known as The American Council for Judaism. The object of the new organization, it was reported in the New York Times, is to emphasize the religious character of Judaism as against the secular nationalistic approaches to it. The new Council is primarily opposed to the establishment of a Jewish State

in Palestine.

This is one of the momentous issues of Jewish life in America today. Rabbi Lookstein has therefore made it the subject of his sermon this Saturday. Those who will come will get the whole inside story of the movement and a forthright clarification and statement of the entire issue. No one ought to miss the Rabbi's sermon this Saturday.
