Fundamental Planning — A Message From The Rabbi

In a week the theatre party and the Year Book will have become history. The fund-raising activity of the congregation will be ended for the time being.

It is desirable to begin as soon as possible the consideration of basic plans to enlarge the congregation numerically and to extend its services and influence religiously, educationally and communally.

In the final analysis congregations are intended for service. Fund-raising is a means to that end, but must never be permitted to become an end in itself. It is true that money must be put in back of everything. By no means, however, should it be placed ahead of everything. I propose, therefore, in the very near future to present to our trustees and membership a comprehensive plan of further activity. This plan will seek the integration of the Men's Club, the Sisterhood, the Sunday School, the Ramaz and the Adult Study Groups into one comprehensive congregational unit. It will provide for certain emergency needs that our difficult-times call for. But it will not lose sight of those eternal values and factors by which and for which synagogues exist.

I shall welcome the counsel and suggestions of our membership and I pray for the continued cooperation of our congregational family in charting the course for the future.
