Thus far three sessions were held at which were discussed the Book of Joshua, the Book of Judges and the two Books of Samuel. Next Wednesday night, Feb. 17th at 8:30 P. M. the discussion will center around the schism which divided the Jewish people into the Kingdom of Israel and the Kingdom of Judah. The minor prophets of the Kingdom of Israel and their contribution to their day will form part of the discussion.

New students will be welcome. Every class is an independent session in itself. Those who plan to come are asked to read in advance the first Book of Kings, either in the original or in the English translation of the Jewish Publication Society.
