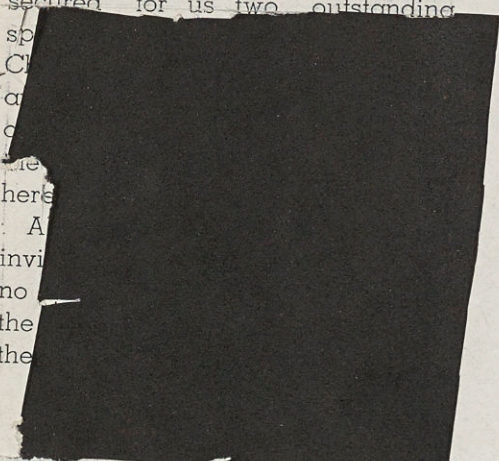


SISTERHOOD NEWS
