WOULD YOU WANT YOUR BOY TO DO WITHOUT PASSOVER?

Every parent ought to ask himself a simple question: If my boy were in the armed forces, would I want him to be deprived of some of those necessities by which he may recall the Passover holiday at home? In North Africa and the Pacific Islands, in England and Ireland and elsewhere, Jewish boys will want to know when Passover comes. It will help their morale and will elicit from them the spirit necessary for the task upon which they are engaged.

A substantial sum from our Passover Relief Fund will go to the Jewish Welfare Board in order to provide necessities for our boys. Many of our members have not yet responded. If it is an oversight, we take this means of calling it further to their attention. If it is just negligence, then we beg them not to delay.

SALE OF CHOMETZ

The sale of Chometz is not merely a formality but rather an important law, the observance of which is necessary for the maintenance of the Kashruth of a Jewish home. Chometz (food or utensils) that is retained over the Passover holidays may not be used after the holiday unless previously sold through the procedure prescribed by the Jewish Law. The sale of Chometz will begin Monday, April 12th.

Rabbi Lookstein may be seen for that purpose in the Synagogue every morning and evening.

ISAAC COHEN WILLS BOOKS TO CONGREGATION

Our congregation received as a bequest from the late Isaac Cohen a fine collection of Hebrew books that formed part of his library. Among these books is a Vilna edition of the Babylonian Talmud.
