We are asked also to observe a partial fast on Mondays and Thursdays during that period and to donate the monies otherwise spent on food to the United Jewish Appeal. In addition at the close of the main meal in every home a special prayer should be recited by all members of the family. A copy of that prayer is enclosed with this bulletin.

\$1,300 RAISED FOR

PASSOVER RELIEF

Our Passover Relief Appeal this year netted the sum of \$1,300 which, while \$200 below the quota set for ourselves, is nevertheless a gratifying sum. Of this amount the major portion went to the Yorkville Passover Relief for providing necessities for the needy of the community. A substantial amount was sent to the Jewish Welfare Board for Passover provisions for our boys in the service. A number of especially deserving individuals and families were also the beneficiaries of the fund.

We thank all who contributed and we pray that they may always be in a position to perform acts of charity in behalf of worthy causes.
