#### MEN'S CLUB NEWS

The question has been asked, "In a world at war, what place has a Men's Club?" To those of us who have uninterruptedly participated in the far flung activities of our group, this is a rather startling query and so we hasten to reply.

As a matter of record, our organization's agenda, even before Pearl Harbor, was harnessed to the national defense program. We were then, even as we are now, effectively cooperating with the Jewish Welfare Board (USO) both in its administrative departments and field service. Ours was the first Men's Club to purchase surgical instruments for "Bundles for Britain"; we were among the early ones to raise funds for "China Relief": we are registered members of the Fighting Free French organization: we have gided the Red Cross as blood donors and as a group contributor; we have from the start been a distributor and donator of Victory Kits to embarking soldiers. In addition to these activities we have steadfastly maintained our various benevolent services such as sending underprivileged children to a summer camp; a Ramaz School scholarship; housing our own Boy Scout Troop; aiding refugees and the unceasing fight against anti-semitism.

Likewise as individuals you will find that there is no segment of the war effort, from the fighting fronts to the purchasing of war bonds, to which we are not contributing. All of us are wholly committed to the unswerving policy of unstintingly giving of ourselves wherever and however we can do the most good. On the home front as well as abroad you may be sure that the K. J. Men's Club as a group and individually, are eagerly and loyally doing their full share in the United Nations Military effort.
