JEWISH WELFARE BOARD SABBATH

This Saturday has been officially designated by the New York Board of Jewish Ministers, of which our Rabbi is president, as Jewish Welfare Board Sabbath. It is intended to dedicate that day to contemplation of prayers for and action in behalf of our boys in the service. This Sabbath happens to fall on the eve of Lag B'Omer, a day traditionally devoted to Jewish military heroes. It is intended, therefore, that we dedicate it anew to the fighting heroes of our day.

The Service Flag will be draped conspicuously above the Holy Ark. The Honor Scroll with the names of the Kehilath Jeshurun boys on it will also be conspicuously displayed. Special prayers will be recited for the well-being of these boys and for the success of the armed forces of our country. The guests of honor at our services will be the parents and relatives of our boys in the service.

Help us make this Sabbath a very significant one by attending services en masse. Bring your relatives and friends. Let us together pray for the well-being of our fighting men and for their speedy return in triumph and peace.
